



# **Cross-cutting Operational Principles**

- $\checkmark$  Use evidence and analysis to better understand risk and resilience
- $\checkmark$  Employ cross sectoral approaches for improved outcomes
- ✓ Practice adaptive management and shock responsive programming
- ✓ Strengthen systems for resilience and resilient systems
- ✓ Operationalize Humanitarian Development Coherence (HDP)



# The Case for Education and Resilience



# Education and Resilience

When education is risk-informed, conflict-sensitive, and equitable, it strengthens resilience at multiple levels. Education:

- ✓ Supports and strengthens social capital
- ✓ Raises the human capital of individuals
- ✓ Strengthens knowledge of and school-level response to natural disasters, health emergencies, and armed conflict
- $\checkmark$  Strengthens the self-efficacy, aspirations, and confidence of individual
- ✓ Improves women's empowerment and gender equality



# Why is Resilience through Education Unique?

The education sector has attributes that make it uniquely placed for building individual, community, and systemic resilience that other resilience programming can leverage. The sector:

- ✓ Retains high public value and demand
- ✓ Reaches populations at scale
- ✓ Serves as a critical hub for information sharing and for other life-saving services





# **Galyam / Resilient Education**

#### Prepare in case of risk

- Preposition materials (IR1)
  - Establish early warning systems
  - Provide matriculation cards (IR1)
  - Establish teacher and student tracking (IRs 1, 4)
  - Disseminate SSD and school neutrality information (IRs 3, 4)

#### Activate response

- EWS: schools of danger, GBF of danger (IR4)
- Report to designated reception center (IR1), provide matriculation number (IR1, 4)
- DPAH and DPEPPNF provide resources(IR4) and report presence of student to central database
- Teachers and students are assigned to host schools
- Host schools provide additional space (IR3)
- Displaced teachers and students continue education
- MHPSS services (IR1)
- GBF analyzes and disseminates information

- Identify likely host communities and storage facilities, reception centers (IRs 1,4)
- Designate school-based focal points (IR3)


